Minutes

- 1.
- a. Christer opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Christer announced that meetings will now be 45 minutes instead of the previously scheduled 1.5 hours.
- b. Christer summarized the agenda for the meeting and the previous meeting's minutes were reviewed.
- c. Christer updated the group about what's been going on with SIREUS since the last meeting. He mentioned the SIREUS Texas Innovation Tour, which took place over four days in February and was a success. University representatives got to visit six university affiliated locations. He also mentioned the ongoing SIREUS ENTREPRENURS forum in Denver, Colorado which many Swedish universities and university startups are participating at. So far, the forum is a great success.
- 2. Christer thanked the SIREUS evaluation group, in which Stefan, Maria and Tina are a part of, for their work. He then informed the group that there was recently a meeting in Stockholm, discussing the feedback from the working groups. The main question discussed was "what happens after February 1st next year?". There have been more meetings since, looking at the recommendations moving forward. On April 9th, there will be a new meeting with the evaluation group on how to proceed before the matter moves on to the steering committee where a decision will be made in May.

- 3. So far SIREUS has conducted three SIREUS RESEARCH forums. Christer informed the group that the average number of attendees is now around 55 people, which is great as many of them are new to the SIREUS concept. He then extended a thank you to all who had passed on the invitations, plausibly causing this surge in attendees. As of now, the SIREUS team is discussing next steps for the forum. One webinar prospect is Åsa Wallin, who recently had a presentation about bilateral funding for cancer research at the House of Sweden in Washington D.C.
- 4. a. Christer reminded the group to utilize the thematic areas and to give SIREUS feedback on focus areas.
- SIREUS currently has 11 American Affiliated Universities. A recent development is that Georgetown University signed with SIREUS to become an Affiliated University. University of Georgia is also interested in working with Sweden, and Christer expects them to sign soon.
- 6. a. Christer invited Therese to talk more about Study in Sweden 2024. Threse shares that she has been conducting meetings in small group where they have discussed possible dates for Study in Sweden 2024. A concern now is that it might clash with EAIE, which is during the weekdays. Because of this a weekend would be preferable for a mingle event at House of Sweden, like last time. She then suggested moving on to New York and hosting a Sweden Alumni event. Followed by moving on to the Bay area and Nordic Innovation House, depending on availability. Seattle and Minneapolis are also locations of interest. There are talks of hosting four events, two on each coast.

Christer then opened up the discussion. Jenny asked if there had been any evaluation of previous events. Maria added to the discussion and asked about the proposal to have events on both coasts. Christer thought it might be too much traveling and too high of a budget. He also answered Jenny that there had been several evaluations which he then briefed her about shortly.

b. The issues regarding marketing for events were raised and Christer concluded that SIREUS will continue working with marketing for specific events, but also incorporate the universities more in everyday marketing.

Jenny pitched in and shared an updated look of the event calendar at the House of Sweden, stating it is more difficult o book the venue on a weekend as House of Sweden is usually open to the public during the weekends.

Christer then moved on and suggested to form a planning group for Study in Sweden. A group of three volunteered and Christer said he would get back to them and schedule a meeting.

c. Lastly, Christer talked about NAFSA 2024, which takes place on May 29th in New Orleans. During this day SIREUS will host a SIREUS MEMBERS forum. SI is involved in the process. Christer is in contact with Cecilia Kjellgren at the Honorary Consulate in New Orleans who is helping with venues and catering. As of now the catering is too expensive, but Christer announced that we are working on it. It currently costs 8000 USD, and the aim is around 4000 USD. A Save the Date will be sent out soon. Member Universities get to fill up 20 slots for free, Affiliated Universities get 5 slots for free, and other universities will have to pay a fee to attend.
